Dear Faithful,

The beating of the Divine Heart has saved us. Let us contemplate the intimate dispositions of the Divine Heart of Christ during the most solemn moments of his life: His Conception, His Nativity, His Death, His Resurrection and the triumph of His Ascension!

Although these states are diverse, His Heart always remains the same, inhabited by the essential devotion that was His: giving Himself to His Father, doing His will in every detail.

Amen."
