Let's go with the shepherds to the crib. And we will find the Virgin Mary carrying in her arms the newborn Child, Who has kept her perfect virginity. A great miracle indeed. A sign already announced by Isaiah: she will remain a virgin and give birth to a Son.

Let's ask the Blessed Virgin Mary about her thoughts. It is said that she kept in her heart the words of those around her. Especially the shepherds, who told her what the angels had told them. Yes, the Blessed Virgin Mary pondered these words. And if we ask her who this Son is, this Child she carries in her arms, she will tell us the angel's words, spoken to her by the angel Gabriel: "He will be the *Saviour of the world*. He will take away the sins of the world and free men from the slavery of sin".

Indeed, what best defines the Infant Jesus is that He is the Saviour. This is also what the angel said to Joseph when he was in doubt and hesitation about the Virgin Mary: "Do not be afraid, Joseph. He who will be born of the Virgin will be the Saviour of the world".

This is what the angels announced to the shepherds on Christmas Eve. They too were waiting for the Messiah; they were waiting for the Saviour, and the angels told them: "This Saviour is born. Generations and generations have waited for the Saviour. He is born, you can go and see Him". And the shepherds went to the Virgin Mary and saw the Saviour.

What, then, were the Virgin Mary's thoughts about this Son? Did she meditate above all on His temporal generation? Apparently not. The Gospel of St. John speaks of the divine generation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. And isn't the Gospel of St. John the Gospel of the Virgin Mary? During the years that St. John kept the Virgin Mary in his care, they were able to converse at length together, and the Virgin Mary, inspired even more than St. John, is certainly at the origin of the magnificent considerations of St. John's Gospel, particularly the Prologue, so admirable that it takes us to the heights of the Holy Trinity. *Et Deus erat Verbum*. And the Word was God, and through Him all things were made. And nothing was made without Him.

This is the eternal God Whom the Virgin Mary carries in her arms. Filled with the Holy Ghost, inundated by the graces of the Holy Trinity, she has surely meditated on the splendours of the realities she carries in her arms. Human realities, but above all divine realities.
